Lead Pipes

- 1. How many healthcare sites that fall within the trust's property portfolio have buildings that are connected to/contain lead water pipes? Belfast Trust has identified lead piping within the following areas:

- Mater Hospital Laboratory 1.5m of underground mains water supply pipe (currently organising for removal).
- Cold water supply pipework to toilets in Old Childrens Admin area – this area has not been in use and is currently locked down due to the presence of asbestos.
