## **Emergency Department Unexpected Child Deaths and Management of Breast Feeding Parent**

We receive unexpected deaths and have a sudden unexpected death in infancy protocol. This is a regional protocol for Northern Ireland.

3. Does your standard procedures or guidance document ask whether a parent is breastfeeding the child that has died?

Yes we ask standard questions about feeding. We specifically ask about breast feeding

4. Does your standard procedures document or guidance include management of the bereaved breastfeeding parent to reduce risk of engorgement, mastitis, and additional emotional distress?

We refer the family to their local General Practitioner. This would include support if the child was breast feeding.

We don't specifically have a policy about reducing engorgement / mastitis and treat each tragedy on a case by case basis.
