## 12 Please provide your podiatry service specification?

The access criteria to the Podiatry Service in Belfast Health and Social Care Trust.

Belfast Trust Podiatry service accepts self-referrals and referrals from all professional disciplines.

All referrals are triaged based on the information received from the referral.

Those patients triaged as low risk will receive a foot health talk. If further clinical information is identified at the foot health talk a one to one assessment will be offered to the patient.

Patients are identified as 'at risk' if they have the following medical condition with a podiatric need

- Bacterial Infection
- Active foot ulceration
- Diabetes, Type 1 and 2
- Renal disease (CKD Stages 4&5)
- Peripheral Arterial Disease (PAD)



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- Lower Limb Amputee
- Rheumatology
- Neurological conditions
- Immunocompromised / immunosuppressed patients
- Sensory neuropathy (loss of protective sensation)
- Paediatric and adult biomechanics
- Nail Surgery
