### Update on Support and Intervention Framework



Belfast Trust has welcomed a move by the Health Minister from **Level 5** on the Support and Intervention Framework to **Level 4**. Minister Nesbitt has also advised that he will move the concerns he had with Cardiac Surgery Services from **Level 5 to Level 3**.

As a Trust we have really led the way regionally in our Being Open work, and there has been a lot of engagement across the whole organisation as we create a People and Culture Strategy for the Trust. Medical leadership is being enhanced and strengthened, our Trust Board governance processes have been completely rewritten, and safety, compassion, and civility are actively written in to all that we do.
