

## Discharge delays

NHS England publishes statistics of patients remaining in hospital who no longer meet the criteria for staying.

Belfast Trust collates statistics on the number of patients who have been declared medically fit and their discharge has been delayed in The Royal Victoria, Mater, Belfast City and Musgrave Park Hospitals.

2. When did you begin to collate these statistics?

Approximately - from 2008

The data below relates to the number of patients whose discharge has been delayed after they have been declared medically fit. A discharge is regarded as complex when it can only take place following the implementation of significant home based or other community based services (including residential or nursing home services). This data excludes paediatrics, patients who are awaiting assessment and patients coded as having no significant delay.
