1. Does the Health board have a Chronic Pelvic Pain Clinic? (yes/no)

Belfast Health and Social Care Trust does not have a commissioned Chronic Pelvic Pain Clinic. However, the service is aiming to try to support patients through the development of a pelvic pathway in the future.

The service has received referrals for 127 patients; however, as indicated above, the service is not commissioned but the Trust is aiming to try to develop pathways for this patient group.
