3. For placements in **residential care settings**, what was the **proportion of placements** with an **average weekly fee above £2,500**, split by:
 - o All placements
 - o New placements
 - o Discharged placements
4. For placements in **supported living settings**, what was the **proportion of placements** with an **average weekly fee above £2,500 (total)**, split by:
 - o All placements
 - o New placements
 - o Discharged placements

5. How many **individuals 18-64 with Prader Willi Syndrome** are there in the area you cover?
6. **For people 18-64 with Prader Willi Syndrome**, how many were supported in:

 - o Residential care settings

8. For people 18-64 with Prader Willi Syndrome, what was the average weekly fee for those supported in:

- o Residential care settings
- o Supported living settings

9. For people 18-64 with Prader Willi Syndrome, what was the proportion of placements with an average weekly fee above £3,000, split by:

- o All placements
- o New placements
